

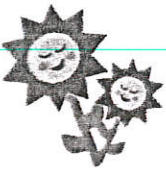
IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Flower arranging

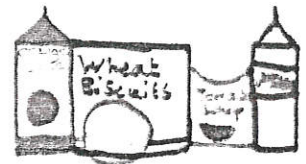


Just a quick reminder, that on Wednesday 4th October in the afternoon all the children will be making a small flower arrangement for the church as part of our harvest celebrations.
